Long-Range Planning Committee, Jerry currently oversees the Museum Pass Program, is Co-Chair of the Scholarship Committee and serves as Co-Editor of the Friends Newsletter. Jerry has co-chaired the annual Spring Book Sale, the Jigsaw Puzzle Sales, including the ongoing "Pop-Up" Puzzle Sale, volunteered at the Children's Book Sale, the Jewelry Sale and coordinated special projects, such as volunteer outreach and the purchase of the Friends storage shed. The Gaston Award, which had not been awarded for nine years, was named for Kenneth Gaston, the first president of the Board of Trustees, and recognizes individuals who are instrumental in supporting the library, promoting it to the Westfield Community and making extraordinary contributions to its overall mission. The board voted unanimously to recognize Jerry for his numerous activities on behalf of the library and his ongoing dedication to the library.

During the Award Ceremony, Harriet Davidson, Co-President of the Friends, and Allen McGinity, Director of the Westfield Memorial Library, offered remarks praising Jerry for his dedication to service, his spirit of volunteerism and his sense of humor.
